- Guided critical reflection
- Reciprocal and mutually beneficial partnerships and collaborations

**Community-Engaged Learning (CEL)** = all students in the course are required to participate in community-engaged work **Community-Engaged Learning Option (CELO)** = students have a choice to participate in community-engaged learning as a final project and/or in lieu of a comparable project.
