Offers a dictionary, an extensive annotated bibliography, a chronology of the era, and statistical information. Also includes a section "Debating the Sixties," which includes ten essays by prominent historians on the most important issues of the era, each of which provides a historical overview and the author's stance on the issue, and an excellent 77-page history of the 1960s.

The ABC-CLIO Companion to the 1960s Counterculture in America

Ref. E169.02 .H3515 1997

Presents some 4,000 alphabetically arranged and cross-referenced entries for people, organizations, art, ideas, places, events, writers, and cultural phenomena related to 1960s counterculture.

Civil Rights in the United States

Cold War America, 1946 to 1990

Ref. E741 .G76 2003

Offers a snapshot of American life, 1946-90, including population, climate, economy, government, cities, people, education, science, and pop culture. Also includes statistics, passages from historic documents, a chronology, maps, several illustrations, and an appendix.

A historical summary of the conflict organized around key controversial questions, an A-Z mini-encyclopedia of all things Vietnam War; an extensive list of resources and documents, and a detailed chronology.

A chronology of significant events, brief chapters giving a synthetic historical account of various topics, and a series of one-page biographical sketches on important personages. Includes an annotated list of 11 documents of the cultural revolution starting with the Port Huran Statement.
- American Decades: 1960–1969* Ref. E169.12.A419
Divided into subject areas. Covers world events, arts, sports, religion, fashion, justice, social trends, etc. Each section includes an overview, topics in the news, headline makers, people in the news, awards, deaths, and publications.
- Great Events From History: North American Series* Ref. E45.G74 1997
Arranged chronologically. Gives dates, categories, key figures, and a summary of events.

Includes several documents from the 1960s that concern democracy. The collection was created with awareness of the importance of sexual and racial inclusion.

Includes a lengthy introduction, chronology, and maps. Documents range from reports to songs to opinion pieces to Supreme Court rulings.
- The Environmental Debate: a Documentary History* GE197 .E7 1999
Chronologically presents 146 documents relating to the evolution of American views on the environment and relationship to it.
- The Women's Liberation Movement in America* Ref. HQ1421 .B47 1999
- Women's Rights in the United States: a Documentary History* HQ1236.5.U6 W68 1994
Includes letters, personal narratives, policy statements, laws, and court decisions covering women's struggle for social, political, legal, economic, and education rights in America from colonial times to 1993.

The book includes photos, audio discs with recollections of demonstrations by Fannie Lou Hamer and the Little Rock Nine; speeches by Medgar Evers, Ralph Abernathy and others; and protest songs of the movement, as well as the voices of segregationist leaders.
