

LOCATING ARTICLES USING INDICES AND ABSTRACTS[Education Full Text](#)http://www.fairfield.edu/lib_databases.htm

Comprehensive coverage of an international range of English-language periodicals, monographs and yearbooks. Full text of articles cover to cover, from hundreds of journals, make this a one-stop source for research. Coverage includes 87 journals not covered by ERIC's CIJE.

1966-present. The ERIC (Educational Resources Information Center) database is sponsored by the U.S. Department of Education to provide extensive access to educational-related journal articles and documents. The ERIC database corresponds to two printed journals: Resources in Education (RIE), which indexes ERIC documents and digests, and Current Index to Journals in Education (CIJE), which indexes journal articles.

An ERIC digest or document is something that has an accession number beginning with the letters "ED" rather than "EJ" (which stands for "Eric Journal"). ED477616 is an example of an ERIC document number. Accession numbers aren't used for locating journal articles indexed by ERIC, however, the numbers are useful for locating ERIC digests or documents. You will find that many of the ERIC documents or digests are available through full text linking in the ERIC database. If that's not the case, you will find them in the black ERIC microfiche cabinets in the library (lower level, behind the periodicals). If you are looking for the full text of a journal article indexed in ERIC, you should click on the "Search for Full Text" link instead.

Topics include not only the literature on primary, secondary, and higher education but also special education, home schooling, adult education, and hundreds of related topics.
