Database

Communication & Mass Media Complete - Database of full text/abstracts of articles published in the professional literature of the communication and mass media fields.

- Indexes about 500 Journals, with over 200 full-text.
- Accessible from anywhere on campus and off campus.
- Use "and" to link words; "or" to find at least one word.
- Truncation is *. **Example: communi*** will produce *communication, communicator, community, etc.*

Finding the Article

Journal Locator – Available from Library Page <http://www.fairfield.edu/library.xml>
A tool that assists the researcher in identifying which full-text databases reference specific journals. Use to find a journal in print or online, if available.
