

Accessing Videos from Fairfield's QuickTime Streaming Server

Computing & Network Services maintains a QuickTime Streaming video server that allows students to view films and videos that have been assigned by their instructors. These videos are available from on and off campus, and require that you have the free QuickTime Player software from Apple (if you have iTunes on your computer, you already have QuickTime installed).

Download QuickTime from <http://www.apple.com/quicktime/download>.

Note for Macintosh users: If you have a Mac running OS X 10.6 (Snow Leopard), you already have QuickTime 10 installed on your computer. Due to an incompatibility between QuickTime 10 and our QuickTime server, you will need to download the previous version of QuickTime, which can be found at <http://support.apple.com/kb/dl923>

Your professor will provide you with a **web address** that you can use to access a movie, along with a **username** and **password**.

- Begin by launching the QuickTime Player program, going to the **File** menu, and choosing **Open URL**.
- In the **Enter an Internet URL to open** box, type (or copy and paste) the movie address and click **OK** when done.
- You will be prompted for a **Username** and **Password**. Enter the Username and Password that your professor has supplied to you and then click **OK**.
- The movie will begin playing in a resizable window. You change the size of the window by grabbing the lower right-hand corner with your mouse and dragging.
