Stags4Hire

The Career Center uses Stags4Hire, powered by Handshake, to coordinate the campus recruiting process. It allows employers to post jobs, review applicant resumes up to the application deadline, and set up the interview schedule.

- Post jobs and internships anytime
- 24/7 access to resumes
- Target specific majors, GPAs, class years
- Post positions for current students and alumni

Posting Guidelines: The number of students that see your posting will vary depending on the time of year you post, the description of the opportunity, and the brand awareness of the organization. A first-time posting may take some time for students to see it and apply.



On-Campus Recruiting

On-campus recruiting at Fairfield takes place all year, however, interviews are not scheduled during exams or when school is not in session.

- Employers interested in arranging on-campus interview dates should contact Sandy Toth at <u>stoth@fairfield.edu</u> prior to the start of the academic year. Dates are scheduled on a first-come, first-served basis.
- Employer presentations are opportunities for employers to promote their organizations to students. They are held before the campus interview date so students can learn more about the organization and career opportunities.
- Interview preparation sessions are usually scheduled the evening before the recruiting date. Employers invite selected students to these sessions.

Extending Offers of Employment

The Career Center is a member of the National Association of Colleges and Employers (NACE) and the Eastern Association of Colleges and Employers (EACE). We adhere to the "Principles of Professional conduct for College Career Planning, Placement, and Recruitment" as published by NACE.

When extending employment offers, "Employment professionals will refrain from any practice that improperly influences and affects job acceptances. Such practices may include undue time pressure for acceptance of employment offers and encouragement of revocation of another employment offer. Employment professionals will strive to communicate decisions to candidates within the agreed-upon time frame."


