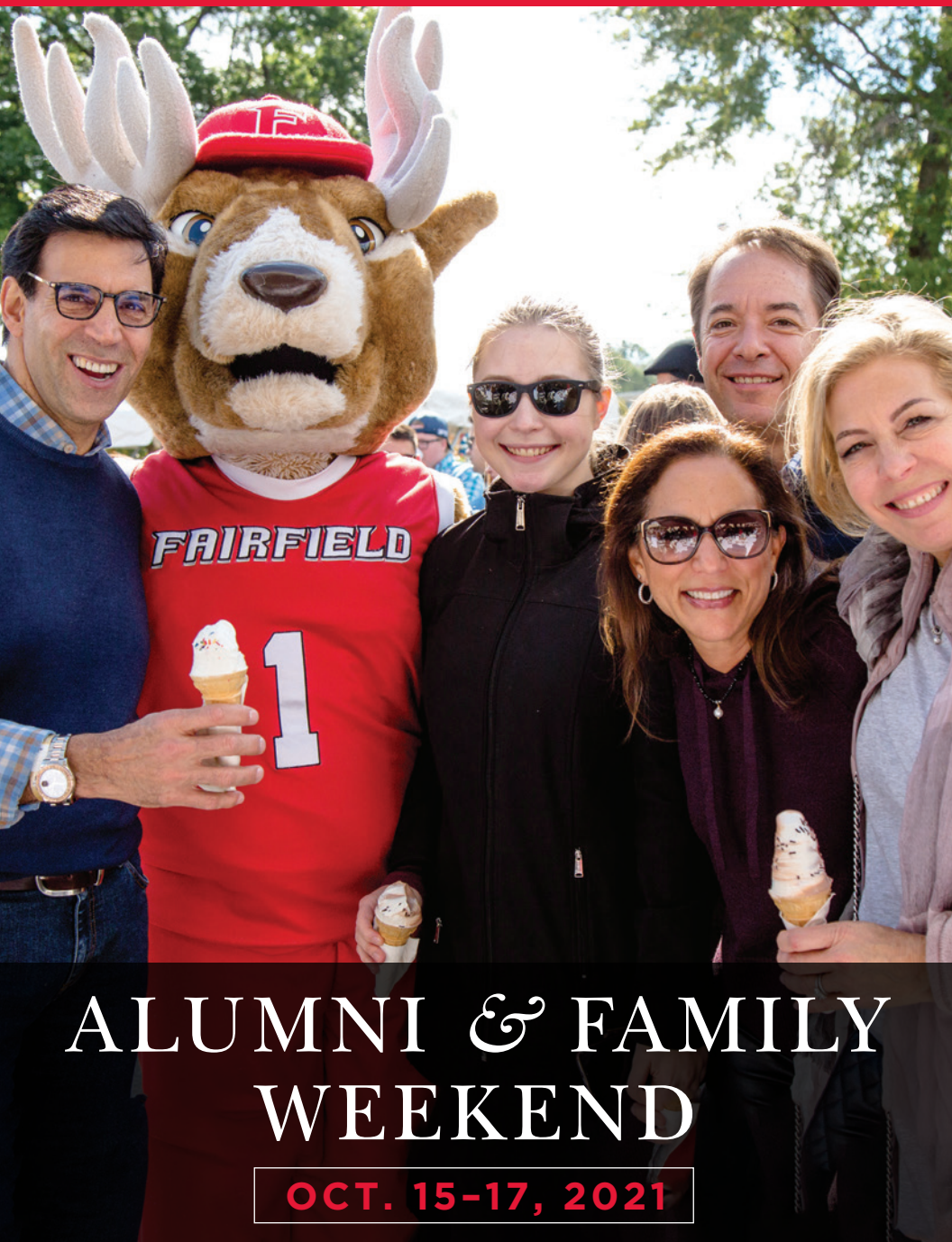

Covid-19

Masks are required for entry into all Fairfield University indoor facilities, regardless of vaccination status. Fairfield University is requiring all visitors to be vaccinated or be able to provide proof of a negative PCR test or antigen test within 72 hours of your first campus event. No at home tests will be accepted. Children that are unvaccinated must also show a negative test. Some of our indoor events will require proof of vaccination or negative test for admittance.

Visitors are asked to refrain from coming to campus if they are experiencing any of the following Covid-related symptoms: Fever or chills, cough, shortness of breath or difficulty breathing, fatigue, muscle or body aches, headache, new loss of taste or smell, sore throat, congestion or runny nose, nausea, vomiting or diarrhea.

Students living on campus are not permitted to host non-student visitors in any University housing.

How do I get my tickets?

STAGFEST: StagFest vouchers can be picked up at the Barone Campus Center, Third Floor Tully Information Desk, until 11:30 a.m. on Saturday. After that time, vouchers will be moved to Bellarmine Lawn for pick up at StagFest. Additional vouchers will also be available for purchase during the event, space permitting. See page 12 for pricing. Cash and credit cards accepted (with the exception of Discover).

TULLY MEALS: Meal vouchers can be picked up or purchased for \$10 at the Barone Campus Center, Third Floor Tully Information Desk prior to each meal time. Children under 10 years of age are free. Current Fairfield University students without a meal plan are welcome to show us their StagCard at the Tully Information Desk to receive a free meal ticket (only to be used during AFW). Cash and credit cards accepted (with the exception of Discover).

MEN'S SOCCER GAME: Tickets purchased in advance may be printed or downloaded on your phone to be scanned at the entrance to Lessing Field. Additional tickets may be purchased at the ticket tent. Lessing Field is a "preferred cashless" venue. All major credit cards are accepted.

QUICK CENTER EVENTS: Alumni & Family ticket pick-up for all Quick Center events is contingent on proof of Covid-19 vaccination card or negative PCR or antigen test within 72 hours of their first on-campus event. Show tickets can be picked up or reserved free of charge at the Quick Center Box Office an hour before showtime. Any tickets not picked up within 10 minutes of showtime, will be given to the next family on the wait list.

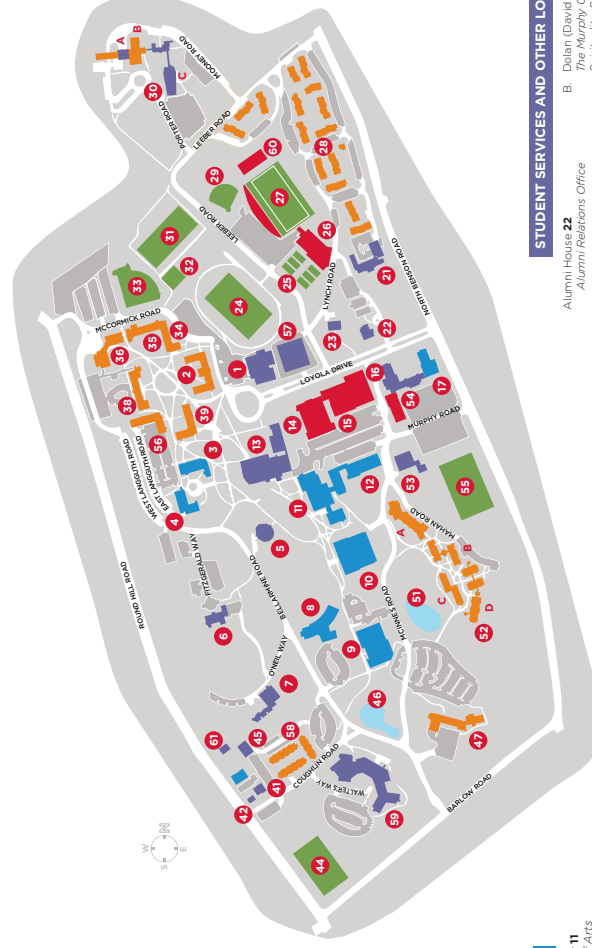
