Fairfield University's "Buy-A-Share" program gives you the opportunity to participate in life-changing service-learning and humanitarian experiences for Fairfield students. From public health nursing and microlending projects in Nicaragua, to humanitarian relief in Atlanta and New Orleans, and building futures for impoverished communities on the Cheyenne River Reservation in South Dakota, Fairfield students are learning what it means to be "global citizens."



On campus, students examine the issues impacting the communities they will be serving. Onsite, they learn to appreciate the challenges and struggles of others, and discover the value of teamwork and compassion.

Most trips are for one week, during semester breaks. Many students cannot afford the costs of transportation and housing, and depend on the generous support of people like YOU! Your contributions—of any amount—make these trips possible.

These experiences are coordinated through the University's Center for Faith & Public Life (CFPL), with the Office of Service Learning and the Jesuit Universities Humanitarian Action Network.
