

Gonzaga Hall Bill of Rights

As a resident of Gonzaga you have certain individual rights and that include:

- The right to quiet during specified quiet hours.
 - o Note that these quiet hours are also applied to those who are outside the building causing noise disturbance.
- The right to a respected white board clean of inappropriate comments and pictures.
- The right to a quiet first floor study lounge, free of personal conversation.
- The right to a smoke free dorm. Smokers must be at least 20 feet away from the building.
- The right to a quiet hallway, free of yelling and foul language.
- The right to a safe hallway free of furniture and sport.
- The right to a cleanly bathroom free of clutter and stranded personal belongings.
- The right to a tidy third floor lounge, free of trash.
- The right to private room, in which people knock before entering
 - o Note, an open door means “Welcome.”
- The right to a safe environment, free of theft.
- The right to an open environment, in which lounge doors are left unlocked.

These rights as a resident are in order to ensure a respectful community.
